At the academy:

We teach one to one classes or small groups with a maximum of 4 students. We also collaborate with a number of primary schools where we teach after-school activities in groups with a maximum of 12 students. The age of our students ranges from 2 to adults.

We work according to the academy calendar which you will be provided before the school year starts

We run classes in the afternoon from Monday to Friday from 4:00 pm to 9:20 pm.

The teaching hours would be distributed from Monday to Thursday, 5/6 hours per day which would make the total of 20 teaching hours plus the amount of time each student will need to prepare their classes

I spent 6 months teaching English at the Academia in Jan-June 2018. I had no prior experience in teaching English and was really nervous to start the placement, worried about teaching students the wrong thing, not being able to answer questions, etc. The training that I received was really helpful – I was able to shadow the teacher that I was replacing for two weeks, which gave me the chance to get to know the students, their personalities, their abilities, and the problems I may face. Both bosses were extremely helpful and supporting throughout my placement, offering me help with everything from my lesson plans, to materials and correcting work. They were also very willing to help me with any problems and offer guidance where I needed it.
